Our vision is to help every kid develop the self-confidence they need to succeed. With generous support from donors, we fund programs that provide marginalized kids with a safe place to call home, a family that loves them, a feeling of community, and opportunities to learn, build self-esteem, and have fun.

The Believe in Me Academic Scholarship Program

Our [scholarship program](#) empowers marginalized students on their pathways toward educational success. Our program is designed to give them access to quality education and to invest in their future. We are committed to helping students achieve their dreams and to unlock their potential.

What Expenses Does This Scholarship Cover?

The Believe in Me Academic Scholarship Program will cover the cost of tuition and fees, textbooks, and on-campus housing for up to four years. We are committed to helping students reach their educational goals by investing in their future.

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Eligibility Requirements

Who Should Apply?

This scholarship program is built for students who are able to demonstrate grit and determination in overcoming adversity. We acknowledge and reward those who have already contributed to their community through extra-curricular activities, work, and religious and volunteer activities.

Unlike many other scholarship programs, this opportunity creates a pathway for students with lower GPA and test scores to pursue their academic dreams. Selection of Believe in Me scholarship winners is based on several factors, with special emphasis on each individual's character, personal merit, career goals, and background.

Successful applicants will meet the following criteria:

- First-generation post-secondary education-seeking students
- Students attending school in Washington State, N. Idaho or Oregon
- Pursuing education at a two-year college, four-year college or university, independent private career school, or trade school
- 24 years of age or less
- 2.75 cumulative GPA in high school or a GED
- Can demonstrate leadership, grit, and perseverance
- Belong to any of the following marginalized groups
 - American Indian and Alaska Native, Asian, African American, Hispanic or Latino, Native Hawaiian, and Other Pacific Islanders, Multi-race, Immigrant Families
 - Living in a household below the poverty line, experiencing food insecurity, or are without housing
 - Adopted, aged out of the foster care system, living in foster care, or wards of the state
 - Students living with a disability, mental health issues, substance abuse disorder
 - Students with incarcerated parents, unemployed parents, parents who did not graduate from high school or did not attend college
 - Students of differing sexual orientation or gender identity
 - Pregnant teens and single-parent students
 - Students experiencing domestic violence, abuse, or trauma; and survivors of human

Application Checklist

- STEP ONE:**
Attend the Info Session (Optional)
Submit questions about the application process by 5:00 pm PST on Wednesday, Feb. 14 to admin@believeinme.org. The info session will cover all questions and provide how-to tutorials for the application process. Use the link on our [Scholarship Page](#) to add the session to your calendar.
- STEP TWO:**
Gather Documents
Download, print, and sign the [Family Authorization Form](#). If you are over 18, you may sign the form yourself. Use the signed form to request Unofficial Transcripts from your school. You'll need to scan and upload the Family Request Form and Unofficial Transcripts in step four.
- STEP THREE:**
Record Video
Get creative and have fun. [Make a video](#) about your "Believe in Me" story, including who first believed in you, how it has shaped you today, and what role this plays for your future goals. You'll need this for the next step! **Max 3 minutes.**
- STEP FOUR:**
Student Information
Fill in your student information form right away to get the process started! If you don't have time to complete the entire form, you can save your progress and come back to it at a later time. We will email you a link to resume where you left off. Don't wait until the week before the deadline or it may be too late to gather everything you need. Remember, we don't contact your references until you submit the form.
- STEP FIVE:**
Write Your Essay
Use your creative writing skills to really showcase who you are and what sets you apart from the other candidates. **Max 250 words or 1,000 characters per question.**
- STEP SIX:**
Get Recommended
Upon submission of your application, Believe in Me will send instructions to your references via email. We strongly encourage you to periodically reach out to them as applications without recommendations will not be considered.

How to Get an Unofficial Copy of Your Transcript

School Website

You can typically generate an unofficial transcript instantly on your school's website. Some schools have portals right on their website, while others have grade-keeping software that runs through their website. With these tools, you can generate an unofficial transcript in a few minutes.

Email

You can also request a transcript by emailing your guidance counselor. Make sure to include where you want the unofficial transcript sent. This can be a great way to get the transcript you need quickly and easily.

Counselor's Office

Your guidance counselor is always there to give you support. If you are having trouble generating or requesting an unofficial transcript, don't worry! Just reach out to your guidance counselor and they will help you out.

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Tips and Recommendations for a Successful Essay

We are looking forward to reading your essay and learning more about you.

The best approach to writing your essay is to frame up your responses in a clear, concise manner that stays within the 250-word limit.

Each essay prompt is designed for a particular purpose; stay focused and answer each question as directly and succinctly as possible, using relevant examples and evidence to support your claims.

Edit and Revise: Check your drafts for grammar, spelling, punctuation, clarity of thought, and conciseness of language. Make sure to streamline your essays by eliminating any unnecessary information or repetitions.

Get Feedback: Take the time to ask a trusted friend, teacher, mentor, or advisor for feedback and suggestions on your essay drafts. A fresh set of eyes may be able to catch errors you missed.

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Describe your life's goals and objectives and how your course of study will contribute to your future career plans. Why have you chosen this path?

*Ideas for your essay

- Describe your short and long-term goals, aspirations, and objectives for life.
- Explain how you plan to achieve these goals, and why they are important to you.
- Highlight any successes or accomplishments that demonstrate progress towards these goals.
- Demonstrate how the skills, knowledge, and experience you will gain in your course of study will contribute to your future career plans.
- Showcase what makes this field of study attractive to you and how it fits into your larger career plans

*Ideas for your essay

- Talk about a time when you overcame an obstacle or faced adversity and kept going despite the odds.
- Discuss how you have gone above and beyond to achieve a goal, even after encountering numerous roadblocks.
- Explain how you used your creativity, problem-solving skills, or resourcefulness to find new solutions and paths forward.
- Describe how you have shown resilience even in the face of major challenges or setbacks.
- Share a story that highlights your commitment, perseverance, and drive to reach a difficult goal.

Your essays should demonstrate style, depth, breadth of knowledge and individuality. **Max 250 words or 1,000 characters.**

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Many people have influenced and mentored you throughout your life. Describe the person who has impacted your life the most and how they have helped you to believe in yourself.

- This can be a great opportunity to think outside the box
- Consider looking around you and finding someone in your life who has shown dedication, passion, resilience, or another quality that inspires you
- It could be a public figure, an older relative, a close family friend, a teacher, or a coach in your community – the possibilities are endless
- Be sure to explain why you feel connected to this person and how their story has helped you to believe in yourself

- Demonstrate your commitment to the goal of this organization: Explain how you have demonstrated a passion for the mission of this scholarship program and why you are dedicated to achieving its goals

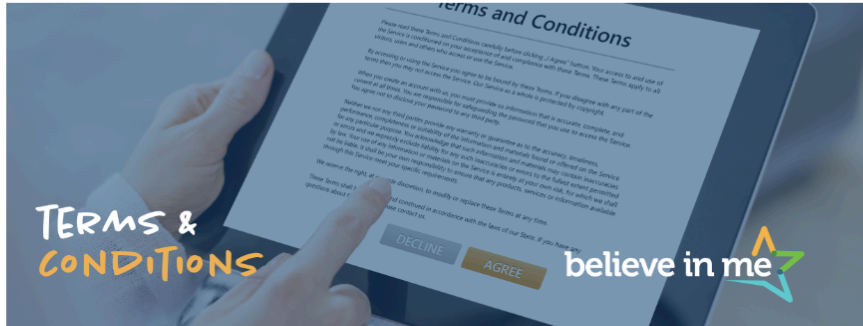
