Believe in Me was established in 2006 to provide shelter, education, health care, and emotional and spiritual support for children. Our vision is to help every kid develop the self-confidence they need to succeed. With generous support from donors, we fund programs that provide marginalized kids with a safe place to call home, a family that loves them, a feeling of community, and opportunities to learn, build self-esteem, and have fun.

The Believe in Me Academic Scholarship Program

Our <u>scholarship program</u> empowers marginalized students on their pathways toward educational success. Our program is designed to give them access to quality education and to invest in their future. We are committed to helping students achieve their dreams and to unlock their potential.

What Expenses Does This Scholarship Cover?

The Believe in Me Academic Scholarship Program will cover the cost of tuition and fees, textbooks, and on-campus housing for up to four years. We are committed to helping students reach their educational goals by investing in their future.

Eligibility Requirements

Who Should Apply?

This scholarship program is built for students who are able to demonstrate grit and determination in overcoming adversity. We acknowledge and reward those who have already contributed to their community through extra-curricular activities, work, and religious and volunteer activities.

Unlike many other scholarship programs, this opportunity creates a pathway for students with lower GPA and test scores to pursue their academic dreams. Selection of Believe in Me scholarship winners is based on several factors, with special emphasis on each individual's character, personal merit, career goals, and background.

Successful applicants will meet the following criteria:

- First-generation post-secondary education-seeking students
- Students attending school in Washington State or N. Idaho
- Pursuing education at a two-year college, four-year college or university, independent private career school, or trade school
- 2.75 cumulative GPA in high school or a GED
- Can demonstrate leadership, grit, and perseverance
- · Belong to any of the following marginalized groups
 - American Indian and Alaska Native, Asian, African American, Hispanic or Latino, Native Hawaiian, and Other Pacific Islanders, Multi-race, Immigrant Families
 - Living in a household below the poverty line, experiencing food insecurity, or are without housing
 - Adopted, aged out of the foster care system, living in foster care, or wards of the state
 - o Students living with a disability, mental health issues, substance abuse disorder
 - Students with incarcerated parents, unemployed parents, parents who did not graduate from high school or did not attend college
 - Students of differing sexual orientation or gender identity
 - Pregnant teens and single-parent students
 - Students experiencing domestic violence, abuse, or trauma; and survivors of human trafficking
- Able to provide a recommendation from two community references
- Involvement in extra-curricular activities, work, religious, or volunteer activities.

STEP ONE: Attend the Info Session (Optional) Submit questions about the application process by 5:00 pm PST on Thursday, Feb. 16 to admin@believeinme.org. The info session will cover all questions and provide how-to tutorials for the application process. Use the link on our Scholarship Page to add the session to your calendar.

STEP TWO: Gather Documents Download, print, and sign the <u>Family Authorization Form</u>. If you are over 18, you may sign the form yourself. Use the signed form to request Unofficial Transcripts from your school. You'll need to scan and upload the Family Request Form and Unofficial Transcripts in step four.

STEP THREE: Record Video

Get creative and have fun. <u>Make a video</u> about your "Believe in Me" story, including who first believed in you, how it has shaped you today, and what role this plays for your future goals. You'll need this for the next step! **Max 3 minutes.**

STEP FOUR: Student Information Fill in your student information form right away to get the process started! If you don't have time to complete the entire form, you can save your progress and come back to it at a later time. We will email you a link to resume where you left off. Don't wait until the week before the deadline or it may be too late to gather everything you need. Remember, we don't contact your references until you submit the form.

STEP FIVE: Write Your Essay Use your creative writing skills to really showcase who you are and what sets you apart from the other candidates. **Max 250 words or**
